- 1. They had just tasted **victory**! (Numbers 21:1-3)
- 2. They grew **impatient**. (Numbers 21:4, Galatians 5:22)
- 3. They **spoke** against God. (Numbers 21:5)
- 4. They were **ungrateful**. (Numbers 21:5, 1 Thessalonians 5:17)
- 5. God sent **venomous** snakes among them. (Numbers 21:6, Genesis 3:1)
- 6. They confessed their sin and asked Moses to **pray**. (Numbers 21:7, Psalm 32:5)
- 7. God **saved** them.
- By looking at a **bronze** snake. (Numbers 21:8-9)
- By looking to <u>Jesus</u>. (John 3:14-15, Deuteronomy 21:22-23, Isaiah 52:13, 2 Corinthians 5:21, Galatians 3:13)
